Raising Confident & Secure Kids in Christ

In seeking to build our children into young people with courage and confidence, it's important for us to understand that true courage comes from knowing who we are in Christ. Here are six guiding principles:

- 1. Confidence is competence-- getting involved at a young age in activities where they can experience success is important.
- 2. Children are not their failures— when they make mistakes, they need to know that their mistakes do **not** define them.
- Speaking words of life-- words carry so much weight, we need to choose them wisely. The beauty of speaking God's Word is that it never returns void.
- 4. Demystifying and debunking worldly culture-instead of saying, "Don't do or say this," we can
 teach our children to see through the lies of
 culture, building confidence in them to defend
 their lifestyle.
- 5. Your courage inspires—it's been documented over and over that one person's behavior can both inspire and trigger the same behavior in others. We need to lead *by example*.
- 6. Firsthand encounters with Christ-- never assume your child has a real relationship with Jesus. Ask them about their faith to see if they are able to tell you if He's made an impact in their life. Also, get them into an environment where God can really meet with them.

God loves our children with a love deeper than they know, and as they discover that more and more for themselves, their confidence will grow. Ron Luce
