As we begin a new liturgical year with Advent, discuss with your family one new habit each of you would like to develop between now and Christmas. Let lighting a candle on your Advent wreath be a time to remind you of your resolve to begin again to become a better person.



# **Embellish Your Advent Wreath**

An Advent wreath customarily has three purple candles, symbolizing penance and waiting, and one pink candle (third Sunday) representing hope. This year you might consider adding a different colored pillar candle in the center of the ring each week: first week-- blue for Old Testament prophets, who heralded the coming of the Messiah; second week-- white for the angel Gabriel, who announced the virgin birth; third week-- green for the shepherds, who were watching their flocks in the field; fourth week-- gold for the Magi, who brought their precious gifts to the Christ child.
