# Advent ~ He is Coming!

The word advent means coming. during the four week Advent season that begins our Church year, we prepare for the coming of Jesus by remembering His birth in Bethlehem (past), anticipating His coming in glory (future), and by celebrating His coming to us in word and sacrament (present).

The Church has appointed scriptures for Advent that tell of God's coming in Christ. This Sunday focuses on the coming of Christ at the end of time-the second coming or *Parousia*. The second and third Sundays focus on the coming of Christ today, to us and to our world. The fourth Sunday focuses on the coming of Christ in history as a child born in Bethlehem.

As we journey through Advent, preparing ourselves for the way God continually comes to us, we are reminded once again that our God is a God of surprises, and no matter how settled and sure we are in our expectations, God always does something new. Thus through our reading, prayer, and sharing with others we will learn more about who our God is and what He wants to do in our lives through the presence of Jesus, who comes once again into our midst.
