Parenting Pointers Susan Vogt

Where does God live? Ask your child. Perhaps each of you can draw a picture of God's home. Is God in the sky, in nature, inside you, even in your enemy? YES! Help your children recognize God as an omnipresent Holy Spirit, who makes everything they see, hear, and touch sacred. You too.

Gaudete Sunday

Guadete Sunday, the third Sunday of Advent, is so called from the first word of the Mass Introit, "Gaudete in Domino semper" expressing the joy of expectation, and gives its name to the day. Advent originated as a fast of forty days in preparation for Christmas commencing on the day after the feast of St. Martin on November 12. This Sunday, therefore, makes a break (like Laetare Sunday during Lent) about midway through a season signifying the nearness of the Lord's coming. As we wait for the coming of Christ, a rose-colored candle is lit on the Advent wreath as a reminder that our waiting will not be in vain.

In both the Office and Mass throughout Advent, continual reference is made to our Lord's second coming. This is emphasized on Guadete Sunday, and it is further marked by a new Invitatory, the Church no longer inviting the faithful to adore merely "The Lord who is to come" but calling upon them to worship and hail with joy "The Lord who is now nigh and close at hand" (Isaiah 9 describing the Lord's coming and the blessings that will result.)
