National Prayer Vigil for Life

Each year on the night before the annual March for Life, at least 10,000 people have filled the Great Upper Church of the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate: Conception in Washington D.C. for the National Prayer Vigil for Life. This year, due to the local restrictions on gathering sizes because of the pandemic, the prayer vigil will be virtual.

Catholics across the country are instead being encouraged to take part in a nationwide prayer vigil beginning 8:00 pm on January 28 from the Basilica starting with praying the Rosary, followed by Mass. Bishops from across the country will lead Holy Hours throughout the night in the livestream vigil. The service can be viewed on EWTN or livestreamed from the Basilica or from the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops. The vigil will end at 8:00 am on the 29th in a closing Mass.
