ST. NICHOLAS OF MYRA

St. Nicholas is the patron saint of sailors and children, as well as of Greece, Sicily and Russia, and bishop from whom the Santa Claus tradition developed. Born somewhere in Asia Minor, he became bishop of Myra, where he was famous for his holiness and pastoral zeal. He was imprisoned during the persecution of the emperor Diocletian and was alleged to have been present at the Council of Nicaea but his name appears on none of the lists. Legends developed around him after his death, and his popularity in the West increased greatly when his relics were brought to Italy in 1087 and his shrine at Bari became one of the great pilgrimage centers of all Europe. Stories of his miracles led to the practice of gift giving in his name at Christmas and to the change of his name, St Nicholas, into Sint Klaes by the Dutch and then to Santa Claus,. His feast day is December 6.
