ST JUSTIN

St. Justin was an apologist and martyr. Born in Palestine, he was moved by the courage of the martyrs and embraced Christianity, "the only safe and worthy philosophy." He taught in Ephesus, later moved to Rome and continued to teach. Justin was the first Christian to consistently use philosophical categories in elaborating an orthodox doctrine of revelation, admirably balancing the primacy of revelation in Christ with an articulation of a revelation universally present. He understood human reason as a seedlike participation in God's reason or Logos, fully manifest only in Christ. Junius Resticus had Justin beaten, then beheaded. His feast is June 1.

KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS

In 1882 it was within the Anti-Catholic climate that Father McGivney founded the Knights of Columbus.
