ST. ANTHONY OF PADUA

1195-1231 St. Anthony was both firm and gentle, which made him an ideal preacher. His over-arching concern was his passion for souls and he pursued them with both strict justice and tender mercy. At age 25 he joined the Franciscans, hoping to go to a foreign mission where he might be martyred. He was sent to Morocco, but fell seriously ill and had to return to Italy. Anthony was an outstanding preacher and became the "Billy Graham" of the 13th century. Thousands turned out to hear him. Everywhere he spoke he generated a spiritual renewal. The Franciscans wanted other men to imitate his successful methods, and St. Francis himself appointed Anthony to teach theology in the community. Many people pray to St., Anthony to recover lost items. Perhaps the practice stems from the occasion when a young friar stole one of Anthony's valuable manuscripts. Anthony prayed for its return, and a menacing vision stopped the fleeing youth, who immediately returned it to the saint. Anthony spent his last five years preaching and spearheading social reforms in Padua. His feast is June 13.
