### ST. ALOYSIUS GONZAGA

1568-91, St. Aloysius Gonzaga is the patron saint of youth. Heir to an Italian principality, Aloysius was prepared by his father for a military career. In 1581 he joined the court of Phillip II of Spain, where he decided to enter the Society of Jesus, a decision his father opposed. Aloysius renounced his inheritance to undertake the novitiate in Rome. He studied philosophy at the Roman College and took his final vows in 1587. He then studied theology, but, while nursing the sick during the plague in Rome, he contracted the disease and died after a three month struggle. His spirituality was marked by a strong devotion to the Eucharist, interior prayer, and charitable service to others. Aloysius was canonized in 1726 and declared patron saint of youth in 1926 as a model of purity, especially for young men who enter holy orders. His feast is June 21. - Encyclopedia of Catholicism
