ST. KATERI TEKAKWITHA

1656-80, St. Kateri, a Native American, is also known as “Lily of the Mohawks”. Born in Ossernenon (Auriesville, NY), she was the daughter of a Christian Algonquin mother and a Mohawk warrior. She survived a smallpox epidemic that claimed the lives of her parents but suffered from facial disfigurement and poor health. Jacques de Lamberville, a Jesuit missionary, instructed Tekakwitha in the Catholic faith and on Easter Sunday in 1676, she was baptized and received the name Kateri (Catherine). Because her Christian commitment and refusal to marry angered her kin, Kateri fled the village and found refuge at eh Mission of St. Francis Xavier near Montreal. There she taught children, cared for the sick and aged, and lived a life of penance and prayer. Kateri, known for her great holiness, died at the age of twenty-four. Her feast is July 11.

Knights of Columbus in Louisiana have provided a proper burial to a Civil War veteran killed in 1864. An American Civil War veteran finally received a proper burial this past winter thanks, in part, to the efforts of Bishop Charles P. Greco Council 1134 and Msgr. Anthony Piegay of Assembly 328 in Alexandria, La.
