Obeying Parents and Those in Authority - The 4th Commandment of God for Our *Good*.

“Honor your father and your mother.”

What does the 4th Commandment require of children? Children must love, respect, and obey their parents and those with lawful authority over them a) because parents and lawful authorities speak in the name of God in regard to their children; b) and because next to God, parents and lawful superiors are the children’s greatest benefactors, like priests and teachers.

Respecting Parents and Authorities

In that capacity, therefore, parents are the representatives of the Lord in regard to their children. ST. JOSAPHAT KUNCEVYCH

St. Josaphat was the first Eastern saint to be formally canonized by the Catholic Church. Born in Ukraine, in 1604 he entered the Holy Trinity monastery in Vilnius, where he was tireless in preaching and in promoting adherence to the Union of Brest, which concluded in 1596 when some of the Ruthenian hierarchy and faithful entered into union with Rome. He was killed by opponents of the Union of the Ukrainian-Belorussian Church with Rome. He was beautified in 1643 and canonized in 1867. His feast day is November 12.
