ST. ROSE PHILLIPINE DUCHESNE

St. Rose was a French missionary and educator. She entered the Visitation order in 1788, but religious persecution spawned by the French Revolution forced the order into exile. After the Concordat of 1801, she joined the Congregation of the Religious Sacred Heart (called in the 1990s the Society of the Sacred Heart). As a missionary to the United States, she established at St. Charles, Missouri, the first convent of the Religious of the Sacred Heart in America and founded many schools and orphanages. She labored among the Potawatomi tribe at Sugar Creek, Kansas; they called her "Woman Who Prays Always." Duchesne, known for her holiness and sacrificial life, was canonized in 1988. Her feast day is November 18.
