**KNOWING YOUR FAITH**

*How can we sin against the respect due to others?*  
The fifth commandment forbids harming not only the body of others but also their souls by carelessly giving scandal - such as when by word, deed or omission we become an occasion of sin for others. Certainly, it would be sinful to lead others into a sinful situation, particularly the young, innocent, or uninitiated in the ways of evil. About the scandal of bad example, Jesus said, "If anyone causes one of these little ones who believe in Me to sin, it would be better for him to have a great millstone fastened around his neck and to be drowned in the depths of the sea. Woe to the world because of scandals... Woe to that man through whom they come" (Mt 18:6-7). By giving scandal people help the devil to destroy souls for whom Christ died. The scandal-giver also shares in the sins which grow out of the scandal. "He (the devil) was a murderer from the beginning...He is a liar and the father of lies" (Jn 8:44). Do not become a soul-destroyer by giving bad example and keep away from those who do this harm. "You have heard that your ancestors were warned: 'You shall not kill, and anyone who does so will be subject to judgment.' But I say this to you: Anyone who is angry with his brother will be subject to judgment" (Mt 5:21-22). And also, "Anyone who hates his brother is a murderer, and you know that no murderer has eternal life abiding in him" (1 Jn 3:15). - Knowing Your Faith, All Basic Catholic Beliefs by Rev. Raymond B.
