ST. ELIZABETH OF HUNGARY

Elizabeth was born into the comfort of medieval Hungarian royalty in 1207. The daughter of a king, she married and became a countess. Always charitable, Elizabeth took joy in attending to the needy. It is said that the roses she carried in the folds of her skirt turned into bread when given to the poor. Tragically, her beloved husband died of the plague, and the broken-hearted Elizabeth gave up her royal life. She moved from her castle to enter the Franciscan Order to live in absolute poverty. Dedicating the remainder of her short life to the elderly, the sick, and the poor, she died of deprivation at the age of twenty-four. Her attributes, are a pitcher, alms, a basket of bread with fruit and fish, and an apron full of roses. Her feast day is November 17th.
