KNOWING YOUR FAITH

What are the main parts of the "Liturgy of the Eucharist" at Mass?

The "Liturgy of the Eucharist" is the second major part of Mass. It includes:

- a) The Preparation of the Gifts and their presentation;
- b) The Eucharistic Prayer with its enactment at the Consecration and the offering of it to the Father;
- c) And the Communion Rite by partaking of the sacrificial meal of Holy Communion.

At the Last Supper Christ instituted the Paschal Sacrifice and Meal. In this unique meal the Sacrifice of the Cross is continually made present in the Church when the priest, representing Christ, carries out precisely what the Lord did and handed over to His disciples to continually perform in His memory.

- a) In the Preparation of the Gifts, the bread, wine, and water are brought to the altar, employing the very same elements which Christ used.
- b) **The Eucharistic Prayer** is our hymn of thanksgiving to God for the whole work of salvation with the offerings becoming the very Body and Blood of our Savior.
- c) The Breaking of Bread together is a sign of the unity of the faithful who in Holy Communion receive the very Body and Blood, soul and divinity of Christ just as the Apostles did from the hands of their Master. Knowing Your Faith, Rev. Raymond B. Fullham, S.J.
