### ST. JUSTIN

Apologist and martyr, Justin was born in Palestine, studied with Stoics, Peripatetics, Pythagoreans, and Platonists, but finally, moved in part by the courage of the martyrs, he embraced Christianity, “the only safe and worthy philosophy.” He taught at Ephesus, where he debated Trypho, a Jew. Moving to Rome, he continued to teach wearing the philosopher's cloak, writing a *First Apology* addressed to Emperor Antoninus Pius and a briefer *Second Apology* protesting recent executions. Other writings, now lost, are known by title. Justin was the first Christian to consistently use philosophical categories in elaborating an orthodox doctrine of revelation, admirably balancing the primacy of revelation in Christ with an articulation of a revelation universally present. He understood human reason as a seedlike participation in God's reason or Logos, fully manifest only in Christ. Junius Rusticus, prefect, had Justin beaten, then beheaded. His feast day is June 1.
